Understanding Cancer

A PROGRAM FOR PEOPLE AFFECTED BY CANCER

The Understanding Cancer Program is a free community education program run by Cancer Council NSW and allied health professionals for people who want to find out more about cancer and how to cope with it.

Patients, carers, family and friends are welcome to attend this one-day program, which is presented by trained facilitators at hospitals and community organisations throughout NSW.

The program offers practical information and discussion about many of the issues people experience after a diagnosis of cancer.

Topics include:

- What is cancer?
- Treatment options and side effects
- Communication with medical team, friends and family
- Personal reactions, self-esteem and body image

- Nutrition and exercise
- Complementary therapies
- Care for carers
- Practical support services available to you
- Community nurses and palliative care
